Street Connect is a mobile service supporting young people aged 15 - 25 experiencing homelessness on the streets of Perth. Without Street Connect, many young people would have no one to turn to for help and support when they need it most.

Street Connect Youth Workers provide support to help turn around the lives of young people experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness when they have no one else to turn to. This winter they need your support!

Our school is setting a very ambitious goal of raising \$25,000. In the lead up to the event, participating students will be running cake stalls, soup kitchens and sausage sizzles to help towards this lofty objective.

## Head of Secondary School - Brad Krokosz

Flashcards are a staple ingredient of a good study program.

If you only have one tool in your toolbelt of study techniques, flashcards should be it. They are easy to make, easy to use and, backed by research, they work! Put your question on one side and the solution on the other, and hey-presto, you're good to go. Flashcards can be used individually to self-test or use them on your peers to check each other's understanding; you can even reverse them (like Jeopardy) and try to determine the question when shown the answer.



When used frequently, they support your recall, backed by research from the Ebbinghaus forgetting curve. Mix up different topics or subjects to aid in your ability to recall knowledge out of order. There is no greater go-to than flashcards.

Flashcards are compact, you can put them in your pencil case, blazer pocket, leave them on the kitchen table (practice before breakfast and dinner) or pull them out on the drive into school or whilst on the bus. In the year we focus on Responsibility for Learning, flashcards are king!

## Police Rangers - Mr Krokosz

Our two groups of Police Rangers enjoyed their fishing expedition to Golden Ponds. The Golden Ponds complex contains over a dozen different fishing ponds stocked with a variety of freshwater fish (or so we were told). Although the first group didn't have much success in 'landing the big one,' much was learnt from the experience. The second group, however, had early luck, with Brock Jackson landing the only catch of the day, a nice Bream.

## Kiss and Drive

Thank you so much for your collaboration and care with the Kiss and Drive procedures. To keep our Kiss and Drive system functioning the best it can, please consider the following actions for a flowing system:

- Kiss and Drive drop off start at 8:05 am and not before as there are no teachers on duty before this time. If you drop your child off earlier than this time, there will be no duty of care in this area so 'drop off(s)' will need to be at the gates near the front office.
- No parents should get out of their car if using Kiss and Drive. This action delays the flow of the system and the drop off(s) for other students.
- The Early Learning car-park bays have a time limit of 10 minutes. Please work with us as a team to ensure safety and care for all students as they arrive and depart at school. If parking for more than 10 minutes when dropping off your child/ren, please use the parking bays near the administration office, off Bishop Road. Please do not use the Kiss and Drive parking bays for longer than 10 minutes.
- Please remember that students need to be in the classroom at 8:25 am
- Please remember that the Kiss and Drive gates are scheduled to close at 8:25 am.
- Be mindful of the small children when driving through and parking in the Kiss and Drive area. We have many large cars and many small children in our school. When reversing be extremely vigilant and drive slowly.

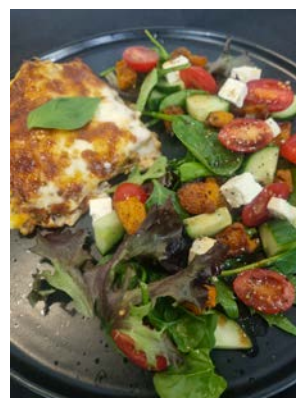
# What's happening around the School

## Year 11-Y12 Food Science - Mrs Nash

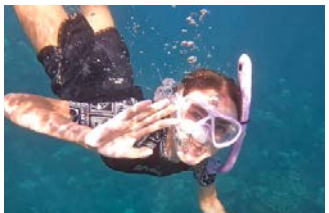
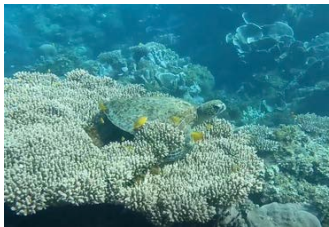
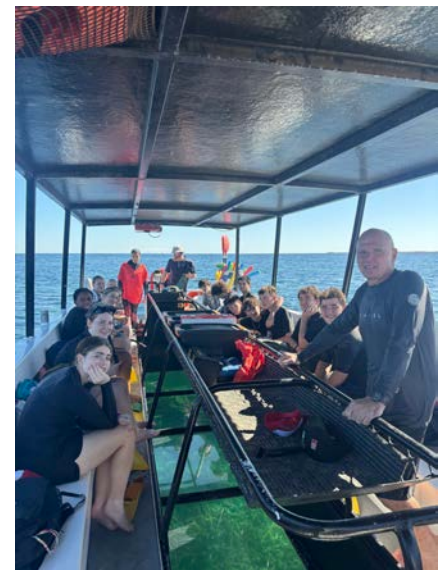
## Year 10 - Ningaloo Camp - Dr Norrish

Every year Dental Health Services (DHS) offers parents and carers the chance to register their kids for free dental care at the School Dental Service (SDS). The offer is open to every student from the year they turn 5 until their 17<sup>th</sup> birthday and includes check-ups, fillings, and simple extractions.

Your child will soon bring home an envelope with an enrolment form, Frequently Asked Questions, and reply-paid envelope from DHS. Just fill in the enrolment form, pop it in the reply-paid envelope, and put it in your nearest post box.

Once we receive your form at DHS our team will register your child and arrange for you to receive an appointment in the mail.
