Always Was, Always Will Be

Each year across Australia, NAIDOC Week celebrations are held in order to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC Week has a rich history in Australia. Beginning in the 1920s, the Australian Aborigines Progressive Association protested to raise awareness of the unfair treatment of Indigenous Australians. In 1938 the Day of Mourning began, being held the Sunday before Australia Day each year from 1940 – 1955. In 1955 the date was changed to July and the day morphed into a celebration day known as Aborigines Day. As time went on, the date was changed again and we began to extend the celebrations of Indigenous cultures, forming the NAIDOC Week we celebrate today.

As part of our continuous efforts to encourage respect for our Indigenous cultures, Court Grammar students were provided various opportunities to participate in NAIDOC Week activities during Week 5. This year's theme of 'Always Was, Always Will Be', became the stimulus for a poster competition throughout the school. This was a great success and enabled many stimulating conversations to occur. Congratulations to the awesome winners; Blayze McAuslan and Indiana Laughlin, who created artistic and thought-provoking pieces, which were proudly displayed throughout the school.

In order to foster the positive relationships between students in both the primary and secondary schools, a number of activities were presented, which enabled students to model the traditional learning environment of our Indigenous Australians, where more experienced generations guide the younger ones. It was a pleasure to watch the kind and respectful interactions between our secondary and primary students.

We hope that each year the NAIDOC celebrations get even bigger and better. Aligning with Court Grammar's strong values based on respect, we are looking towards creating a greater understanding of our Indigenous Australian cultures, which in turn helps to generate an environment that is truly inclusive and embraces diversity.

Outside The Locker Room

This term, Court Grammar School has partnered with Outside The Locker Room (OTLR) to improve the wellbeing of our students.

OTLR is a registered charity established in 2015. They deliver mental health education and welfare support to sporting clubs, schools, and workplaces across Australia. In Western Australia, their program is funded by the Australian Government Department of Health under the Community Health and Hospitals Program.

It was a pleasure having OTLR presenters at Court Grammar School recently. Two sessions were held with our Year 9 & 10 cohorts, focusing on;

Mental Health

- Identifying support networks
- Signs of someone going through a tough time
- Seeking help / helping others
- Mindfulness (e.g. journaling or reading a book)
- Grounding (e.g. walking barefoot on grass)
- Emotional release (e.g. letting yourself cry)
- Self-care (e.g. having your favourite meal or a bath)
- Challenging thoughts (e.g. responding with positive self-talk)
- Being of benefit (e.g. helping others or volunteering)
- Problem-solving (e.g. seeking information or support on the problem)

Cyber Safety

- What power you have as a bystander
- How to respond to cyberbullying
- Why people bully online

Each of the 6 Pastoral Care Groups, students and Pastoral Care Advisors made a pledge that “Stigma Stops Here” by signing the banner provided by OTLR as a gift to the school.

Now, for the next 12 months, students aged 13 and over, parents and teachers can receive ongoing individual support via the OTLR welfare app.

Parents, teachers and students (of any age) can also reach out for support via wawelfare@otlr.org.au.

I am confident that the education and support offered by OTLR will strengthen our School and community, and reduce the stigma surrounding mental health challenges.

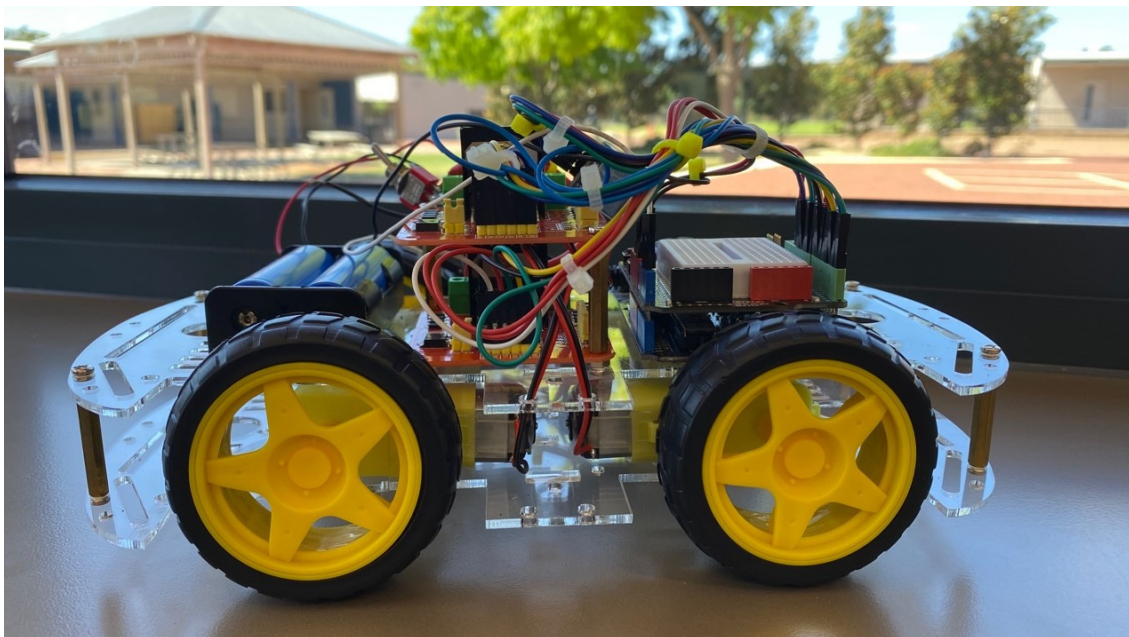
Digital Technologies

The Future Proofing Study 2021

Court Grammar School will be working with the Black Dog Institute and UNSW, along with 150 other schools, to build the most comprehensive picture yet of the mental health and wellbeing of Australian teenagers. The Year 8 cohort of 2021 will be invited to try out new mental health apps and complete surveys about their health and wellbeing at school until they are in Year 12.
