Science week has been a busy time for many of the staff and students this week, with a wide variety of activities occurring. As the week's topic was celebrating 50 years since the moon landing, we naturally thought making our own rockets was a great way to celebrate. Students in years 1 and 2 had the luxury of working with our skilled year 11 students from Physics and Integrated Science in designing, building and launching bottle rockets.

Students from year 10 Science Advanced were also very excited and willing to lead our Pre-Primary and Kindergarten students through some scientific experiments in the Senior School lab. The Lab had been kindly decorated by students in year 7 to look like outer space, with hanging planets, blacked out windows and a variety of lighting and glow in the dark effects. The primary students in attendance had a fantastic time experiencing these science demonstrations.

Students in years 7 - 9 had the opportunity to design and build a rocket that had an engine built into them. After some difficulties 2 were fired off to the delight of many onlookers. The rest of the rocket launching will be rescheduled.


Years 3-6 students completed some very creative experiments from making moon rocks, anti-gravity sand, painting and creating their own galaxies and testing out balloon rockets. This challenged the children and gave them a fantastic chance to get creative and experimental.

Primary classes will also complete in a STEM challenge and will finalise the planets they created, to add to their solar system

within their classes.






PRIMARY NEWS STUART LEARMONTH HEAD OF PRIMARY

Anglicare Sleepout and child poverty...something to consider...

Recently through my study I have been looking at the definition of child poverty in context of living in a wealthy country. This lucky country we live in, is a wealthy country, so growing up in such a place means the context of being poor is not what you or I may first assume.

The United Nations defines child poverty in a wealthy country as:

Three meals a day

- At least one meal a day with meat, chicken or fish (or a vegetarian equivalent)
- Fresh fruit and vegetables every day
- Books suitable for the child's age and knowledge level (not including schoolbooks)
- Outdoor leisure equipment (bicycle, roller-skates, etc.)
- Regular leisure activities (swimming, playing an instrument, participating in youth organizations etc.)
- Indoor games (at least one per child, including educational baby toys, building blocks, board games, computer games etc.)
- Money to participate in school trips and events
- · A quiet place with enough room and light to do homework
- An Internet connection
- Some new clothes (i.e. not all second-hand)
- Two pairs of properly fitting shoes (including at least one pair of all-weather shoes)
- The opportunity, from time to time, to invite friends home to play and eat
- The opportunity to celebrate special occasions such as birthdays, name days, religious events, etc.

This Friday night, 25 students and three staff from our School are going to sleep rough to raise both awareness and funds for Anglicare. Funds raised for the School Sleep Out go to Anglicare, WA's Street Connect service. Street Connect youth workers provide support to help turn around the lives of homeless young people who have no one else to turn to.


