Yr 11 & 12 Outdoor Education Camp

The Yr 11/12 Outdoor Education students undertook in a 3 day expedition at Manjedal Activities Centre last week, this is a compulsory component of the Yr 11/12 Outdoor Education syllabus. The students have to plan and prepare for the camp, including providing their own food and water supplies.



On 4 September, the Yr 11 and 12 Outdoor Education classes set off for their 3 day expedition. These classes were separated into two teams and called themselves ' The Outback Rangos' and ' Team Kuya'. The two teams had to compete against each other for the entirety of the camp and fight for the win to receive a prize.

The first and most difficult task was the race to be the king of the hill during the walk from School to Manjedal Scouts Camp. This walk created a lot of conflict between the individuals, especially from carrying our massive packs and a tub of water around 20kg per group.

On the second day we took part in a high ropes course, which was a blast, firstly we organised ourselves into groups of three, where one person was taking on the high ropes, meanwhile the other two people belayed the person at the top, the people at the bottom were responsible for those at the top, not to fall down. For a lot of people this was a challenge they had to face, but everyone encouraged one another to give it a red hot go. After about an hour we parted into our two separate teams with each team nominating one team member to go up against one another at paper scissors rock, to choose the better course to compete on for their advantage. The competition then began; we were racing to see who could get the most members across the course in the set amount of time. Then to our surprise, we played Frisbee Golf, organised by the teachers.

By day three we were all absolutely knackered and ready to be home. We separated into our groups again to complete our search and rescue task; however, both teams didn't complete this in the set amount of time. This was a real challenge, you had to really keep a close eye and be clever about the hiding spaces. The activity provider taught us lots of tips and tricks about the hiding spaces after completing the task. We then waddled off to archery where we got our aim on point. We set into our teams again to battle out to discover which team had a more average accurate aim. By about 12:40 pm it was time to walk back to reception to be picked up by the bus and set off back to school. Everyone was beyond ready to be at home, shower and go to sleep in a comfortable bed.



I cannot believe that we have reached the latter part of Term 3 already where we must begin to turn our thoughts to planning and preparing for 2020. Many parents and caregivers have started to ask if their child can be in a certain class or be with certain friends next year. We always take note of such requests and consider them; however, I must make it clear that decisions of class placement remain at the discretion of the School. Next year will be the first year in the Primary

School that we will operate on a two-stream basis across the School. This means that we will have 2 classes of each year level from Pre-Primary to Year 6. Our Pre-Kindergarten students will attend on Mondays or Fridays whilst our Kindergarten students will attend school on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. To clarify any information about how this process works or if you have any questions, please direct these to me in the weeks and months to come.

Last year, we introduced a whole day of orientation activities for every child in the Primary School. This was very successful and allowed our existing students and our new students to come together and meet their new teacher(s) for the new year ahead. We will do this again this year and this will take place on Tuesday 19 November 2019. Information about this will come home via See Saw in the weeks to come.



Could I please offer a polite reminder to all parents and caregivers to alert the School if a child is going to be absent from School. In accordance with information in the Student Organiser, parents are requested to notify the School of any known absence or illness by 9 am on the morning of **each** School day. Students arriving late will be required to sign in and produce a note signed by parents. For extended periods of absence, parents and caregivers are requested to put these requests in writing to the Principal. Where a child's attendance falls below 80% in any one semester, I write to parents and request a meeting to discuss this.

NAPLAN Reports

If you are a parent of a student who undertook the NAPLAN tests in May this year, you will soon receive an individual report of your child's results.


The report will show your child's NAPLAN results for Numeracy, Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation on an achievement scale.

The Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 Literacy and Numeracy Assessment Results are reported on a scale from Band 1 to Band 10. This scale represents increasing levels of knowledge, understanding and skills demonstrated in the assessments.

For NAPLAN results, a national minimum standard is defined and located on the assessment scale for each year level. Band 2 is the minimum standard for Year 3, band 4 is the minimum standard for Year 5, band 5 is the minimum standard for Year 7 and band 6 is the minimum standard for Year 9. These standards represent increasingly challenging skills and require increasingly higher scores on the NAPLAN scale.

ACARA have also created a short video on how to interpret your child's NAPLAN report.

Hopefully we can keep up our winning streak next year.


