Spotlight on Students



As we reach the endpoint of Term 3, I would like to congratulate all students on a term filled with hard work, learning and strong effort. Term 3 tends to be a term where we think we are going to have a quiet time; however, with so many exciting and stimulating events going on this term, it has flashed past and we are ready to enter Term 4 already. In my last article, I discussed some of these events in some detail. In this newsletter, I must express thanks to Miss Dhu for a wonderfully organised Athletics Carnival and subsequent Inter-School Athletics Carnival at All Saints College. This was the first time we have entered a team for such an event and seeing the enthusiasm and drive of our

children was, as always, a real treat. Thanks also to Mr P. Taylor, Mr Fitton, Mrs Brown and Miss Schutz for an out of this world Year 5 Space Camp on Friday of last week. Our children are so very fortunate to have such rich and varied activities as a part of their learning programme and I am very thankful to all involved in these initiatives.

NAPLAN results for 2019 were shared with parents and caregivers of Year 3 and 5 children recently. For those of you who are unaware, NAPLAN is an annual national assessment used with students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in order to determine progress across Literacy and Numeracy. Although NAPLAN is only one such method of measuring progress, it is a good benchmark for us to ascertain where our strengths



and development needs lie for us as a School. I was very proud to see that our results across Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation and Numeracy are either level with the national standard or almost at the same level. Over time, we have continued to grow in these areas, and I feel that this is down to our engagement with new, evidence-based teaching methodologies and programmes, alongside having such dynamic and dedicated staff. Reading forms a part of our strategic development as a Primary School next year. Although our results were slightly higher than in 2018, I would like to see this increase more in years to come. In 2020, the Primary School leadership team will extend to include a Curriculum Coordinator. Alongside myself, Mr R. Taylor and Mrs Vos, this leader will shape the development of some of our curriculum priorities as we move forward.



As we move into the holidays and then onto Term 4, may I remind all families and students of the importance to wear hats and sunscreen whilst using outdoor environments at School. We have a firm 'no hat, no play' policy in the Primary School in order to safeguard our students from the harmful UV rays of the sun. Although we have several undercover areas where children can eat and play, hats are a staple of our uniform and I ask for your support in ensuring that your child(ren) always has this at School. Please send children to School with sunscreen applied and we will of course remind students to re-apply regularly as the day goes on. I hope that you and your children have a wonderful break and I look forward to welcoming everyone back on Monday 14 October for Term 4.






Equestrian News


Yr 5 Space Camp


