Day 2 had the group venturing inside both the Opera House and the Harbour Bridge to see the equally impressive views from the inside. ## R U Legal?

### A guide for parents in the digital world.

On Monday **16 September** at 5.30pm we will be hosting a talk from Casey Johnston, a solicitor from Legal Aid WA. The focus of the talk is on the legalities that young people are faced in today's digital world.

Topics covered will include:

- Sexting
- Image-based abuse
- Cyberbullying
- Filming young people fighting
- Legal consequences for young people who break the law

Did you know?

**10+** Any person over the age of 10 can be charged with a criminal offence.

**U18** It is against the law to share an image of someone who does not consent OR is under the age of 18.

It is against the law to create, keep, share or ask for material that shows a young person under the age of 18 being subject to torture, cruelty or physical abuse.

Many of our young people today have become oblivious to the law when it comes to the use of social media. They run the risk of getting themselves into serious trouble as well as potentially damaging their future for jobs or for travel.
